The Instrumentation and Electrical Controls Systems Technician (O&M Tech) performs or assists in the development and construction of new equipment systems, maintenance, repair, replacement and basic design of control systems including electronic, pneumatic, mechanical and electrical instrumentation, computerized control systems, and computer network equipment employed in the operation of the wastewater treatment plant, sanitary and storm pumping stations; and performs other related work as required.

In the Maintenance Department we have five O&M technician classifications and may fill at the O&M technician 2, 3, or 4 level for this vacancy. Potential position placement will be dependent on qualifications.

QUALIFICATIONS

EDUCATION:

High school diploma or equivalent; additional technical school or college-level course work related to instrumentation and industrial automation is highly desirable.

EXPERIENCE:

Two years of experience in the installation, maintenance and repair of instrumentation, electrical and controls systems equipment in a water or wastewater treatment plant; or in an industrial environment installing, maintaining and repairing instrumentation, electrical and control systems.

Possession of the California Water Environment Association (CWEA) Electrical Instrumentation Technologist Certificate is highly desirable.

Possession of a valid California Class C Driver's License and a satisfactory driving record as a condition of initial and continued employment.

O&M Technician 2

\$36.31 – \$45.39 per hour

The O&M Technician 2 is the second level in the O&M Technician series. This position continues to receive on-the-job training and experience while performing routine duties on an assigned shift.

O&M Technician 3

\$42.23 - \$54.04 per hour

The O&M Technician 3 is a journey-level position in the Technician series. This position may require an Electrical/Instrumentation Technology Certification grade I within two years of date of appointment to this position and may be asked to obtain California Water Environment Association Grade II-IV Electrical/Instrumentation Technology Certification as determined by the Director of Operations and Maintenance

O&M Technician 4

\$49.58 – \$61.97 per hour

The O&M Technician 4 is an advanced journey-level position in the Technician series. This position may require an Electrical/Instrumentation Technology Certification within two years of date of appointment to this position and may be asked to obtain California Water Environment Association Grade III –IV Electrical/Instrumentation Technology Certification as determined by the Director of Operations and Maintenance.

BENEFITS

- Eligible the first day of the first month after date of hire, medical coverage is offered through PERS Health Benefits Plan. District's contribution toward health benefits is equal the cost of family coverage for PERS Kaiser HMO plan.
- Dental and vision insurances for the employee and eligible dependents are paid 100% by the District.
- Life insurance coverage of \$50,000.
- The District participates in CalPERS retirement and contributes to Social Security.
- The District offers deferred compensation plans through a 457 plan.
- The District has no specified holidays. Employees may accrue up to 100 hours of holiday time which may be used with supervisor approval.
- Vacation is accrued at 80 hours (3.08 hours/pay period) for the first 3 years.
- Sick leave accrues at 96 hours (3.69 hours/pay period) per year. The District participates in a sick leave incentive program and sick leave death benefit.
- Personal leave accrues at 24 hours (0.93 hours/pay period) per year.
- The District offers a short-term disability plan and employees are exempt from participating in the State Disability Insurance (SDI).
- The District offers a long-term disability plan.
- The District offers a cell phone allowance of \$30 per month.
- Retiree Health Benefits are provided to employees at least 50 years old with a minimum of 5-years CalPERS-credited service with the district and a total of 10 years CalPERS-credited service to be eligible for 50% premium contribution up to 20 years service credit to be eligible for 100% premium contribution (based on a years of service percentage contribution table).
