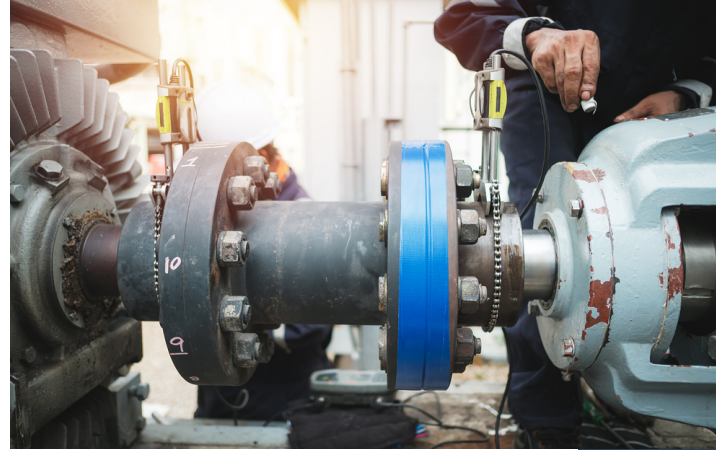

THE POSITION

Under general supervision of the Maintenance Supervisor, the Maintenance Mechanic maintains, repairs, and installs wastewater treatment plant equipment, machinery and related facilities; maintains a variety of records; participates in special projects; and performs a variety of technical tasks relative to assigned areas of responsibility.



IDEAL CANDIDATE

The ideal candidate will have excellent interpersonal skills in order to work in an effective manner with all levels of employees. The desirable knowledge, skills and abilities include, but are not limited to:

- Mechanical working knowledge of internal combustion motors, diesel motors, electrically and fuel driven pumps, hydraulic equipment, gear reducers, pneumatic equipment, and basic electrical concepts.
- Experience performing preventative routine maintenance procedures, disassembly, repair, parts and bearing replacement, and rebuilding of mechanical, hydraulic, and pneumatic equipment.
- Ability to work alone or as part of a team with self-motivation and a positive attitude towards teamwork.
- The ability to check, test, troubleshoot, service, repair, rebuild, install and align facility pumps, motors, drive units, gas engines, air blowers, air compressors, and related mechanical equipment.
- Interpret manuals, drawings, and diagrams.
- Functional knowledge of operation and maintenance of various types of sewer pipe line cleaning and inspection equipment.
- Perform all other related duties as assigned and/or directed.

DUTIES

Examples of duties include but are not limited to:

- Operation of a wide variety of hand and power tools and specialized equipment.
- Perform skilled mechanical maintenance work in the repair, installation and alteration of wastewater treatment equipment and facilities.
- Perform skilled plumbing maintenance work in the repair, installation and alteration of water lines, sewer and other facilities and equipment.
- Perform both skilled and routine tasks related to a variety of wastewater facility maintenance needs.
- Maintain daily records of tasks in maintenance system.
- Drive vehicle on District Business as needed.

QUALIFICATIONS

Technician series qualifications vary based on education, experience and certifications listed below.

Education:

High school diploma or equivalent; additional technical school or college-level course work related to plant mechanics is highly desirable.

Experience:

Two to five years of experience in the installation, maintenance and repair of equipment in a water or wastewater treatment plant; or in an industrial environment installing, maintaining and repairing equipment such as pumps, motors, HVAC, gear boxes, power transmission equipment, Co-Gen engines, boilers, piping, and valves.

Certification:

Possession of a Plant Maintenance Mechanical Technologist Certificate from the State of California Water Resources Control Board is highly desirable.

Possession of a valid California Class C driver's license and safe driving record is required.

OPERATION & MAINTENANCE SERIES

O&M Technician 1

\$28.84 – \$36.03 per hour

The O&M Technician 1 is an entry and training level class in the O&M Technician series. This position receives on-the-job training and experience while performing routine duties on an assigned shift under continuous and immediate supervision.

O&M Technician 2

\$36.31 – \$45.39 per hour

The O&M Technician 2 is the second level in the O&M Technician series. This position continues to receive on-the-job training and experience while performing routine duties on an assigned shift.

O&M Technician 3

\$42.23 - \$54.04 per hour

The O&M Technician 3 is a journey-level position in the Technician series. This technical position performs a variety of skilled tasks and more complex duties related to the maintenance of the District's wastewater treatment plant and collection's system.

O&M Technician 4

\$49.58 – \$61.97 per hour

The O&M Technician 4 is an advanced journey-level position in the Technician series.

BENEFITS

- Eligible the first day of the first month after date of hire, medical coverage is offered through PERS Health Benefits Plan. District's contribution toward health benefits is equal the cost of family coverage for PERS Kaiser HMO plan.
- Dental and vision insurances for the employee and eligible dependents are paid 100% by the District.
- Life insurance coverage of \$50,000.
- The District participates in CalPERS retirement and contributes to Social Security.
- The District offers deferred compensation plans through a 457 plan with an employer contribution of \$2,787.03 for 2021 (adjusted annually based on October CPI).
- The District has no specified holidays. Employees may accrue up to 100 hours of holiday time which may be used with supervisor approval.
- Vacation is accrued at 80 hours (3.08 hours/pay period) for the first 3 years.
- Sick leave accrues at 96 hours (3.69 hours/pay period) per year. The District participates in a sick leave incentive program and sick leave death benefit.
- Personal leave accrues at 24 hours (0.93 hours/pay period) per year.
- The District offers a short-term disability plan and employees are exempt from participating in the State Disability Insurance (SDI).
- The District offers a long-term disability plan.
- The District offers a cell phone allowance of \$30 per month.
- On-site gym as well as plant bicycles.
- Retiree Health Benefits are provided to employees at least 50 years old with a minimum of 5-years CalPERS-credited service with the district and a total of 10 years CalPERS-credited service to be eligible for 50% premium contribution up to 20 years service credit to be eligible for 100% premium contribution (based on a years of service percentage contribution table).
